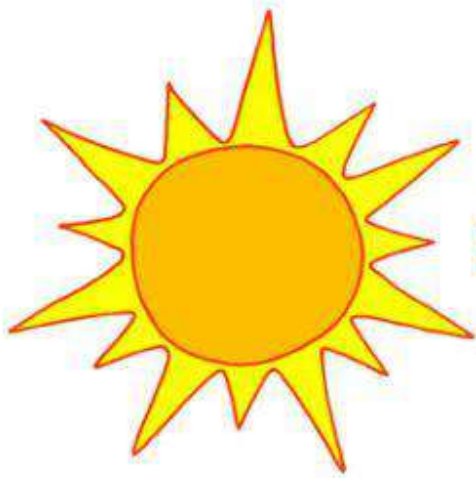

3. Is the registration (re-enrollment) fee refundable? No the registration (re-enrollment) fee is not refundable.
4. **Why aren't spots being held for current families?** In order to properly staff the school with highly qualified employees, I can't wait until the last minute to staff the school. I did not open registration to new families until almost two months after it was opened to new families in order to give our current families first choice. I do appreciate all of our current families and I would hate to lose anyone but deadlines I have to meet with budgets and hiring.

#### Annual Enrollment Fee

The Enrollment Fee is due at the time of acceptance (with enrollment) to secure a space for your child(ren); it is due annually and is non-refundable.

#### Please note:

- Yearly and monthly tuition is paid through the FACTS program. Monthly tuition is paid on the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month beginning in July. There is a \$36.00 annual Administration Fee charged by the FACTS Program.
- All scholarship award letters must be submitted by July 20<sup>th</sup> or you will be responsible for monthly payment.
- Any difference between scholarship awards and stated tuition is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. Families that are awarded 100% of Step Up for Students will be responsible for paying \$150.00 per student.
- Students with an Early Learning Coalition Child Eligibility Certificate will receive VPK credit for morning.
- St. Andrew also accepts School Readiness (4C). Parent fee set by School Readiness (4C) must be paid weekly.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students will have a \$250 graduation fee added to their tuition and paid via the FACTS account based on their FACTS payment plan.





**Important message for the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (income-based):**

As a result of additional available funding, the 2017-2018 application season for the 2017-2018 Florida Tax Credit Scholarship applications will remain open until we maximize all available awards.
